

“In God We Trust” ...

We see the phrase so much it's become cliché numbing the meaning to the point of fighting to remove it from our vocabulary in America.

To trust... or not to trust... that's the question.

What does it really mean?

I'm on this kick... of seeing practices, or principles, carried out in the natural as testimony to the Spiritual principles revealed in the Holy Bible. I find it peculiar that some of these disciplines in the natural seem to be recognized and used by wealthy “old money” families to pass their wealth onto their children and children's children in hope they'll do the same. The mob—the masses—the public... seems to be oblivious to these practices.

What do you think I'm talking about with the following points?

- The only way to completely protect your assets and wealth from destruction of predatory governments and attorneys is to not own them directly—you transfer your ownership to a party other than yourself.
- Once you do, you can't change your mind—it has to be irrevocable.
- You have to truly transfer your complete rights of ownership—you can't retain and demand specific rights... quotas... thresholds... from whom you've transferred, or entrusted, your ownership to, but you do expect them to act in your best interests—to protect you.
- For them to protect you, the party you entrust has to be outside the reach of, or jurisdiction, of your predators.
- Your protection is sketchy if the transfer is not based on, and the entrusted party doesn't recognize and practice, sound law—common law.

What I'm describing is an *international trust* setup to protect assets, and the entrusted party is known as the trustee of the trust—the protector of your interests.

I'm not an expert on nor am I advocating you setup an *international trust*.

So... why get into the dry jargon of trusts?

Is there a more secure trust out there?

I think there is... it's what I'd call a *Universal Trust*.

Or... I also know it as the *New Covenant of the Kingdom of God*.

And, the points of jargon from the *international trust* translate to the *Universal Trust* ...

- If we want to protect our ultimate asset from our ultimate predator, and be able to build and pass on our wealth, we transfer complete ownership of this ultimate asset—our life... *Whosoever shall seek to save his life shall lose it; and whosoever shall lose his life shall preserve it* (Luke 17:33). When we transfer our life into God's hands through trusting Christ's sacrifice at the Cross, we have victory over our predatory enemy—death—Satan. We're now able to build Capital (bear Fruit of the Holy Spirit)... we'll live forever enjoying this wealth and passing it onto the next generation—the nations.
- Once we accept Christ's Blood, God is committed to us, but... we can't change our mind—it has to be irrevocable... *No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God* (Luke 9:62).
- We think we can... but when it's on the line, we know we can't... demand specific rights—quotas—thresholds... from God... *for I have learned, in whatsoever state I am, therewith to be content...* (Philippians 4:11)... *In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you* (1 Thessalonians 5:18). We don't bark orders at God, but we're at rest because we know our entrusted party does have our best interests at heart... *And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose* (Romans 8:28).
- The party we entrust our life to is God... the Father—Christ, our Lord—the Holy Spirit. God is our Trustee, and He's outside the jurisdiction of our enemies—the predatory world... *And having spoiled principalities and powers, he made a shew of them openly, triumphing over them in it* (Colossians 2:15)... *that in me ye might have peace. In the world ye shall have tribulation: but be of good cheer; I have overcome the world* (John 16:33)... *For whatsoever is born of God overcometh the world: and this is the victory that overcometh the world, even our faith* (1 John 5:4).
- Our protection is not sketchy. Why? The Trustee and the Trust adhere to sound Law... *Think not that I am come to destroy the law, or the prophets: I am not come to destroy, but to fulfil* (Matthew 5:17).

When we trust, we transfer our assets into the Trust so our Trustee can protect our wealth—our life... and [the future of the next generation—the nations](#). If not, we're alone and vulnerable to destruction... *knowest not that thou art wretched, and miserable, and poor, and blind, and naked* (Revelaton 3:17).

When the predators come after us, we can say... “don’t look at me... I don’t own anything including my life... my Trust does... take up your attack with my Trustee.” We have confidence—we trust our Trustee to act justly and righteously on our behalf... in our best interest... to protect us... *No weapon that is formed against thee shall prosper; and every tongue that shall rise against thee in judgment thou shalt condemn. This is the heritage of the servants of the Lord, and their righteousness is of me, saith the Lord* (Isaiah 54:17).

In the natural, people trust the trust and the trustee through *substance and evidence* of forming and maintaining the trust—in the Spiritual, we trust the Trustee and His Trust through the *substance and evidence of our faith*—the Fruit of the Spirit we bear.

Next time I see... *In God We Trust*... I’ll remember, I trust the Trustee... His Trust.

It’s all about trust... *whoso putteth his trust in the Lord shall be safe*... (Proverbs 29:25)... *Every word of God is pure: he is a shield unto them that put their trust in him* (Proverbs 30:5).
